 Highlights/Initiatives School Counselor and Family School Counselor are available to children and families upon referral and also run groups such as: Lego, Lunch Bunch and Rainbows program to support students with social, emotional and friendship skills. Division Mental Health Transition Consultant works intensively with students in most need and provides a bridge to Alberta Health Services. All grades chose a social emotional goal to support their students. These have included, growth mindset, self-affirmations, peer relationships programs among others. The school supports students in need of daily snacks and meals as well as families in need at Christmas. School wide breakfast program available everyday for students that need nutrition. School-wide Positive Behaviour Plan has clear expectations posted in different areas of the school focusing on the actions we expect to see. Universal lessons are provided by the school counsellor to meet the needs of every grade level. Topics include resilience, relationships, empathy. 	 Highlights/Initiatives Student-led monthly award celebrations honour children in a whole school gathering. These celebrations recognize the 7 Sacred Teachings through a Catholic context with prayer, scripture and intentions. Each class participates in Service Learning activities throughout the school year. Some examples include a Giving Tree, Train of Hope, and door decorating for families in need. Grades host faith based celebrations throughout the school year such as Thanksgiving and Advent. Counsellor and administration lead Spiritual Me Lessons and Mindful Me sessions each week. Faith Coach at the school coordinates faith events such as our annual Religion Retreat in May. Grade 4 leadership students lead social justice projects such as writing letters to seniors who reside in Bethany and lead prayers for the school.

 Highlights/Initiatives Daily support for identified students with literacy and numeracy intervention teachers. We are a trauma informed school. For example, we begin each day with Soft Starts to assist students in self-regulating and relationship building. We will host a Career Day in March where students dress up like the occupation they endeavor to have. Various speakers will also present information on their different careers. We offer a variety of STEM learning in our Makerspace/Learning Commons including spheros and robotics. Teacher professional learning communities focus on knowing, understanding and responding to pir learners in the areas of literacy, numeracy, and social emotional wellness. 1 to 1 device access for Chromebooks and Ipads for all of our students. 	 Highlights/Initiatives Literacy and numeracy specialists work in small groups to support children in their learning goals. Use of Maker Space in Learning Commons to engage students in the create to learn mindset. Every class has a Maker Space block in the learning commons each week. Literacy and numeracy screens for grades 1-4 which assist with classroom programming and learning supports. Literacy intervention teacher works with students who are at-risk and provides small group targeted lessons to bring students to grade level. We have a strong focus on phonemic awareness and phonics reading instruction. Students have access to decodable books to support the Science of Reading instruction
