



Effective memorization

Visualization

Create vivid mental images related to the word's meaning. Visualize scenes or scenarios that involve the word.



Mnemonic devices

Create acronyms, rhymes, or memorable phrases using the target words. Use the first letter of each word to form a memorable acronym.

Association

Associate new words with familiar words, images, or concepts. Create mental connections to enhance recall.

Multisensory

Write the word, say it out loud, and create a physical action or gesture associated with the word.

Word maps

Create a visual representation of the word's relationships, synonyms, and antonyms.



Croissant

Visualization

Visualize the layers of a croissant as you imagine its buttery and flaky texture.



Mnemonic devices

Create a mnemonic like "Crispy, Over-the-top, Irresistible, Slightly Sweet, Anticipated, Nutty, Treat."

Association

Associate "croissant" with a visual image of a freshly baked, golden brown croissant.

Multisensory



While saying "croissant," engage in a multisensory experience by imagining the smell, taste, and texture of a croissant.

Word maps

Create a word map with "croissant" at the center and related terms like "pastry," "breakfast," and "French cuisine."



Word maps



French word charades

- Gather into small groups with fellow parents.
- Each group will work together to decipher and act out French words.
- Receive a set of French words related to daily activities or objects.
- Assign one person in your group to be the "charader" for the first round.



French word charades

- The designated charader will silently act out the French word, while the rest of the group guesses.
- Rotate the role of the charader within your group for each new word.
- You have one minute for each round.
- After the rounds, we'll use a quick digital poll or form for feedback.
- Vote for the most entertaining charade in your group.
- Consider how incorporating fun activities like charades can enhance language learning.

What does data say?

Positive attitude and student performance

Studies consistently show a positive correlation between parental attitude towards a second language and a student's academic success in language immersion programs.

Language development and fluency

Research indicates that children's language development is influenced by their exposure to and interaction with the language outside the classroom.



What does data say?

Parental involvement and language proficiency

Studies emphasize the importance of parental involvement in language immersion programs for the development of students' language proficiency.

Long-term language maintenance

Language proficiency tends to decline if not consistently practiced over time.



 - ii. Recommended podcasts: "Coffee Break French," "InnerFrench," and "News in Slow French."






